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stone being E. R. Parler's corner of a former purchase and runs thence with the lines of said E. R. Parler purchase as follows: N. 19-30 E., (passing just East of a spring) 450 feet to a stone and pointers on a small ridge; thence still with said lines, N. 1 W., 370 feet to a stone just beyond the top of a ridge; thence still with said lines, N. 36-45 E., 186 feet to a stone and pointers on the West side of said ridge; thence S. 49 E., 69 feet to a stone and iron pipe on the top of said ridge; thence a new line, S. 13 E., 1,316 feet to the center of the Fuller Mountain Road; thence with said road, N. 69-45 W., 200 feet to a stake; S. 73-20 W., 150 feet to a stake; N. 69 W., 60 feet to a stake; N. 19-15 W., 190 feet to a stake; N. 54-15 W., 100 feet to a stake and N. 39-30 W., 105 feet to a stake; thence leaving said road and running N. 19-30 E., 25 feet to the point of Beginning, and containing 9.4 acres.
