Whereas, Tannie Sweetenburg, departed this life February 18, 1926, in estate, seized and possessed of an undivided one-half interest in and to the property hereinafter described, leaving as her sole heirs and distributees, Marie Sweetenburg Walker, a daughter, and Walter P. Sweetenburg, a son and whereas Marie Sweetenburg Walker is desirous of conveying her undivided fractional interest in said property to Walter P. Sweetenburg, who was already, prior to his mother's death, owner of undivided one-half interest in said property, so that Walter P. Sweetenburg will own the entire fee, now therefore,

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That Marie Sweetenburg Walker,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00) and love and affection for my brother, the grantee herein Dollars

to in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Walter P. Sweetenburg

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Walter P. Sweetenburg, his heirs and assigns, all of my undivided fractional interest in and to the following described property,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Austin Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, situate on Gilders Creek, waters of France River, adjoining lands of L. A. Fowler, William Dehaeyer, W. P. Meters and others, being a part of a tract of land conveyed to W. A. Adams by C. J. Hill by deed dated the 20th day of December, 1927 and recorded in Book "III" at page 1045 and having the following metes and bounds,

beginning on iron pin in Mill Road on the old line of the above mentioned tract and running thence with the said road S. 10 W. 14.00 chains to angle in road; thence S. 21 1/2 W. 3.10 chains to angle; thence N. 2 1/4 W. 1.60 chains to angle; thence N. 42 W. 2.20 chains to iron pin on bluff near the Mill house; thence S. 12 1/4 W. across the creek 2.80 chains to iron pin in old road; thence with said old road S. 61 W. 2.82 chains to iron pin in angle of road; thence N. 22 1/2 W. 2.11 links to center of Gilders Creek; thence down the meanders of said creek as a line about 21 chains to old line of W. P. Leavelle estate; thence with said line N. 12 W. 11.50 chains to stone; thence N. 71 W. 27.00 chains to the beginning, containing 20 and 25/100 acres, more or less.

This being the same property conveyed to W. P. Adams by Stevens Realty Company by deed dated March 10, 1930 and recorded in the P. O. Office for Greenville County in Book 226 at page 207; and conveyed by W. P. Adams to Walter P. and Tannie Sweetenburg by deed dated April 20, 1927 and recorded in the P. O. Office for Greenville County in Volume 312 at page 100.
