to us ----- in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Ray J. Greene -----

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Ray J. Greene and his Heirs and Assigns forever:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing Seventy-one and 95/100 (71.95) Acres, more or less, according to survey and plat by W.P. Morrow, Surveyor, dated December, 1935, on State Highway No. 11 about two miles westward from Gowensville, and having the following courses and distances, to wit:

Beginning at the corner of B.T. Boone and Pearl Howard, and running thence S. 82.30 E. 13 chains; thence N. 7.30 E. 6.38 chains; thence N. 76.30 E. 11 chains; thence N. 11.30 E. 11.25 chains; thence N. 9.30 E. 5.60 chains; thence N. 6.30 W. 6.27 chains; thence S. 78.30 W. 8.40 chains; thence N. 13.00 W. 4.50 chains; thence S. 72.30 W. 18.94 chains; thence S. 1.30 E. 27.24 chains to the beginning corner.
