

(2) "All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the Easterly side of West Dorchester Boulevard, near the City of Greenville, being shown as Lot No. 115, Section 1, on a Plat of Belle Meade recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book GG, at page 95, and being described as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Easterly side of West Dorchester Boulevard, 950 feet South from Camden Lane, at the corner of Lot No. 116, and running thence along the Easterly side of West Dorchester Boulevard, S. 5-38 E. 50.3 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing along the Eastern side of said Boulevard, S. 6-44 E. 34.7 feet to an iron pin, at corner of Lot No. 114; thence with the line of said lot, N. 83-16 E. 125 feet to an iron pin, at corner of Lot No. 98; thence with the line of said lot, N. 0-42 E. 83.2 feet to an iron pin, at corner of Lot No. 116; thence along the line of said lot, S. 84-22 W. 135 feet to the beginning.

The above described property being the same conveyed to William Jefferson Culpepper by Deed recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 534, at page 94."

Said property has an estimated value of \$11,000.00 and is subject to a Mortgage held by C. Douglas Wilson & Co. dated September 9, 1955, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Mortgage Book 651, at page 253, on which the balance due is \$10,581.00; and is also subject to a Mortgage held by Waco Childers, Jr. dated September 11, 1955, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Mortgage Book 671, at page 394, on which there is due a balance of \$871.65; and the amount due on these Mortgages is in excess of the estimated value of the property.

Your Petitioner further claims a Homestead in all of the personal property listed in Schedule B-2, namely:

One 1951 Pontiac

One 1954 Allis Chalmers Tractor with plow, harrows and attachments - Transplanter, wagon, Tobacco Curing machine.

Said property has an estimated value of \$4,150.00 and is subject to Mortgages aggregating \$5,066.63, which is in excess of the value of the property.

These exemptions are claimed by the Bankrupt as his Homestead in accordance with Article 3, Section 28 of the South Carolina Constitution and Sections 34-1 and 34-41 of the South Carolina Code of 1952.
