Grantee agrees that as a part of the consideration for this deed, this property is sold under and subject to restrictions against use of said property for the sale of petroleum products and against use of said property as a restaurant, cafe, dining room, or other similar establishment, which restrictions shall remain in effect for fifteen (15) years from September 21, 1951, and subject to a setback agreement. Said restrictions and setback agreement are fully set forth in deed from The Atlantic Refining Company to Greenville Petroleum Company by deed dated August 27, 1951, recorded in the Office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County in Deed Book 442, Page 357, and in the deed from Greenville Petroleum Company to Catalina Restaurants, Inc., dated September 21, 1951, recorded in the Office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County in Deed Book 442, Page 351.
