

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That WE, Allen Terrell, Jr. and Martha Terrell McLeod and Allen Terrell in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of . Eighteen Thousand and No/100--to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Robert S. Small (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Robert S. Small, his heirs and assigns, forever:

ALL that lot of land situate on the Northeast side of the Laurens Road, in the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, South Carolina, being shown as Lot No. 3 of Block C, on plat of Carolina Court, made by R. E. Dalton, Engineer, November 1922, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book "F", at page 96, and having according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northeast side of Laurens Road, at joint front corner of Lots 2 and 3 of Block C, and running thence along the line of Lot 2, N 28-02 E, 198.3 feet to an iron pin; thence S 55-26 E, 64 feet to an iron pin; thence with the line of Lot 4, S 27-0 W, 198.4 feet to an iron pin on the Northeast side of Laurens Road; thence along the Northeast side of Laurens Road, N 55-45 W, 67.8 feet to the beginning corner.

A strip along the entire front of this lot lies within the boundary of the right of way of Laurens Road.

This is the same property conveyed to Mrs. Ira M. Terrell by deed of First Morse Realty Corporation, dated August 4, 1936, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 185, at page 307. Subsequently Mrs. Ira M. Terrell died intestate August 27, 1944, leaving as her sole heirs at law the grantors, Allen Terrell, her husbank and Allen Terrell, Jr., and Martha Terrell McLeod, her only children.
