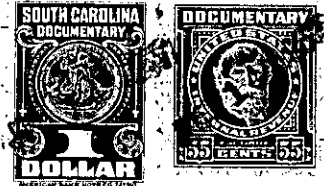

of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, upon receipt of \$129.64

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release
unto the said Harold D. Pridmore

All the right, title and interest of the minor respondents, Betty
Lou Pridmore Snyder and Linda Lee Pridmore, in and to all those two lots
of land in Greenville County, South Carolina, containing eleven acres,
more or less, being the same property conveyed to Emma Pridmore by deeds
recorded in the Greenville County R. M. C. Office in Vol. 107 at page
334 and Vol. 92 at page 53.

Reference to these deeds is craved for a fuller description.

This is the same property owned by Emma Pridmore at the time of her
death in 1931. Emma Pridmore died in 1931, intestate, leaving as her
heirs at law, her husband, George L. Pridmore, and her children, Willie
Pridmore, Eunice P. Woods, George W. Pridmore, Jesse B. Pridmore, Charles
P. Pridmore, Mary P. Andrews, Garvin Pridmore, Thomas Pridmore and Harold
D. Pridmore.

Willie R. Pridmore died intestate in 1955 leaving as his heirs at law,
his wife, Verna Pridmore, and his children, Patricia Ann Pridmore, Betty
Lou Pridmore Snyder and Linda Lee Pridmore.
