All that parcel or tract of land lying in the County of Greenville on head branches of Govens Creek waters of the South Facolet River beginning on a stone and running thence north 52° east 19.85 chains to a pine stump; thence north 52° east 20.95 chains to a stone; thence south 32° west 12.60 chains to a dead chestnut; thence south 28° west 19.10 chains to a White Oak down; thence south 23° east 13.30 chains to a stone; thence north 70° west 12.25 chains to a stone place of Black Oak gone; thence north 35° west 29.75 chains to the beginning; stone corner, containing 82½ acres more or less.
