Forty-five Hundred (\$4500.00).....Dollars

to us.....in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents

by Dorothy Mae Buckley.....

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents

do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Dorothy Mae Buckley and her heirs....

and assigns:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Oneal Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, on the North side of the road leading from Double Springs Church to Milford Church, containing Twenty-two and one-half (22.5) Acres, more or less, and having courses and distances according to a survey and plat by H.L. Dunnahoo, C.E., dated September 24, 1946, as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin on road, corner of Page tract, and running thence N. 12.45 E. 1535 feet to large Spanish oak; thence S. 74.45 E. 772 feet to iron pin; thence S. 21.00 W. 1432 feet to iron pin on edge of road; thence along said road, N. 87.45 W. 592 feet to the beginning corner.
