For more complete description see Lease Contract dated the 28th day of October, 1958, between National Oil Company, Incorporated and Arkansas Fuel Oil Corporation recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds for Cabarrus County, North Carolina, in Deed Book 289, page 273; et seq, and lease and short-form exhibits executed thereunder in accordance with paragraph 27 of said Lease, and recorded in Book Number 611, page 28, Greenville County Register of Mesne Conveyances, South Carolina. The property located in Greenville County, South Carolina, being further described as follows:

All that certain tract or parcel of land, situated in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pin on the northwest property line of Hudson Street, 30 feet in a northeasterly direction from the center of the tract of the Columbia & Greenville Division of the Southern Railway, which pin marks the right-of-way of said railroad, and running thence along the northwest line of Hudson Street North 32 degrees 00 minutes East 100 feet to a drill hole, the south corner of property of Tabernacle Baptist Church; thence with line of said church property North 39 degrees 57 minutes West 199.25 feet to an iron pin, the east corner of property of Max W. Goodlett; thence with Goodlett line South 32 degrees 27 minutes West 100 feet to an iron pin on said railroad right-of-way; thence South 40 degrees 00 minutes East 200 feet with eastern boundary of said railroad right-of-way to the beginning corner; being the same lot of land conveyed to National Oil Company, Inc., by Petroleum Oil Company, by Deed dated May 15, 1922 and recorded in the Office of Register of Mesne Conveyance for Greenville County in Book H, page 403.
