

"The right of way to be acquired shall be seventy-five (75) feet in width during construction, but the width of the permanent right of way shall be fifty (50) feet measured twenty-five (25) feet from the center of said pipe line or lines, in, upon, and through the property of Clyde Childs, as shown on a plat prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service, August 4, 1958, which plat is attached to and made a part of this Notice of Condemnation.

The location of the center of the said pipe line or lines as the said pipe line or lines pass through the property of Clyde Childs according to said plat will be as follows:

Entering the Northwestern boundary line of the property of Clyde Childs at a point approximately 322.5 feet Northeast from a point in Bates Crossing Road at Station 530+49 of the survey of the North Saluda Reservoir pipe lines, and runs thence through the property of Clyde Childs, S. 18-47 W., 400 feet, more or less, to Station 534+539, near a driveway; thence still through the property of Clyde Childs, S: 21-06 E., 275 feet, more or less, to Station 537+399, in the Southwest boundary of the property of Clyde Childs, which point is also located in Bates Crossing Road.

The property affected by this right of way is the same property conveyed to Clyde Childs by two deeds of Vinia Patton, the first dated April 2, 1932, recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 167, page 8, and the second deed, dated April 17, 1940, recorded in said RMC Office in Deed Book 220, page 286."

Clyde Childs died testate on May 20, 1959, devising this property to his wife, Myrtle S. Childs. See record in the Office of the Judge of Probate, Apartment 706, File 3.

and to construct and maintain in, upon and through said premises, in a proper manner, a pipe line or lines, air vents, blow off connections, manholes and other necessary apparatus incident thereto, using the necessary appliances and machinery for such work for the purpose of conveying water through the premises above described, together with the right at all times to enter upon said premises for the purpose of inspecting said line or lines and making necessary repairs and alterations thereon, together with the right to cut away and keep clear of said pipe line or lines all trees and other obstructions that may in any way endanger or interfere with the proper operation of or access to the same.

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
