GREENVILLE, S. C. CHARTER BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

MAY 15 9 22 AM 1960

WHEREAS,

W. H. ARNOLD, of Greenville, S. C. OLLIE F. WORTH R.M.C.

and

ROBERT F. PLAXCO, JR., of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 11th day of May, 1960, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is PEDIMED, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy and sell, develop, lease, mortgage and engage in the handling of real estate and all necessary incidents thereto; to buy and sell securities, notes and mortgages and any other evidence of indebtedness; to manage and control properties for itself and others and to do all things that may be done by a general business corporation under the laws of the State of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars payable in cash or securities or otherwise as directed by the Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One Hundred Fifty (150) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 9th day of May, 1960, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: W. H. Arnold and Robert F. Plaxco, Jr.

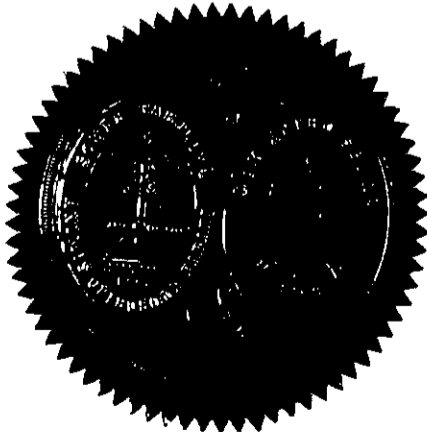
EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, W. H. Arnold; as Vice-President, Robert F. Plaxco, Jr.; as Secretary, Robert F. Plaxco, Jr.; as Treasurer, W. H. Arnold

NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
