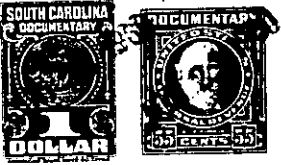

in consideration of the sum of One Hundred, Sixty-One and 74/100 - - - - (\$ 161.74) - - DOLLARS, and the assumption of mortgage set out below to the grantor(s) in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by the grantee(s) (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said grantee, Samuel Wayne Summers, his heirs and assigns forever:

All that piece, parcel or lot of land, with the improvements thereon, situate, lying and being in or near Greenville, in the County of Greenville, South Carolina, and being more particularly described as Lot No. 480, Section 2, as shown on plat entitled "Subdivision for Abney Mills, Brandon Plant, Greenville, South Carolina", made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, Greenville, S. C., February, 1959, and recorded in the Office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Plat Book QQ at pages 56 to 59. According to said plat the within described lot is also known as No. 34 Dorsey Boulevard and fronts thereon 57 feet; being the same conveyed to me by Abney Mills by deed dated May 12, 1959 and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 624, at page 378.
