CHARTER

BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

did on the 29th day of August, 1960, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is SURE WAY FINANCE CO.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is as stated on the attached sheet.

(1) To operate as a finance company actively and regularly engaged in the business of purchasing or discounting accounts or notes receivable or installment obligations, or making loans secured by any of the foregoing or by tangible personal property; further, to lend money in any amount, including short or long term loans, upon any appropriate security, including securities, chattels, real estate or personal credit.

(2) To buy, sell, underwrite, deal in, guarantee, or hold stock, bonds, notes, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness in securities issued by corporations, governments, or individuals.

(3) To act as brokers, agents, and adjusters in the business of life insurance, accident and health insurance, casualty insurance, loan or credit insurance, or any other class of insurance, to the extent and in the manner allowed by the State of South Carolina.

(4) To buy and sell automobiles, appliances, or chattels at wholesale or retail, both in casual transactions and in a regular business, and for these purposes to operate and maintain automobile car lots, stores, or other appropriate establishments.

(5) To borrow or raise monies for any of the purposes of the corporation by sale or discount of corporate holdings, or by evidence of indebtedness secured by the hypothecation of any corporate assets.

(6) To do everything necessary, proper, advisable, or convenient for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any of the objects herein set forth and incidental, or pertaining to, or growing out of, or connected with its business or powers.

(7) The specifications herein contained of particular powers is not intended to be and shall not be held to be in limitation of the general powers herein contained, or in limitation of the powers granted to corporations under the laws of the State of South Carolina.
