I, M. F. Reid, United States Marshal for the Western District of South Carolina, SEND GREETING:

Whereas, the United States of America on or about the 6th day of March, 1959, filed its Complaint (Civil Action No. 2532) in the United States District Court for the Western District of South Carolina in the Greenville Division of said District against Olive Court, Inc., Nell G. Parrish, Tax Commission of South Carolina, demanding judgment in relation to the premises and property mentioned and described and on August 1, 1959, an Order of the Court was signed whereby it was adjudged and decreed that said premises and property hereinafter mentioned and described be sold by the United States Marshal for the Western District of South Carolina on the terms and for the purpose mentioned in said Order; and the said United States Marshal after having duly advertised the said premises and property for sale by public outcry on the 8th day of September, 1959, did then, openly and publicly, and according to the custom of auction, sell and dispose of same to J. H. Sitton and W. R. Crossfield, their heirs and assigns, for the sum of One Hundred and One Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$101,000.00), they being at that price the highest bidders therefor; subsequent to the sale a motion was filed by the mortgagor, Olive Court, Inc., to set aside the sale, and the Hon. C. C. Wyche, United States District Judge for the Western District of South Carolina, by an Order dated September 17, 1960, filed on September 19, 1960, in the Office of the Clerk of Court for the Western District of South Carolina, dismissed with prejudice the motion of the mortgagor,
