CHARTER
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

ANDREW B. MARION, P. O. Box 629, Greenville, S. C.

and

FRED D. COX, JR., P. O. Box 629, Greenville, S. C.

did on the 11th day of July, 19 61, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is **ECONOMY TEXTILES, INC.**

THIRD: That the principal place of business is **North Pleasantburg Drive, P. O. Box 3725, Park Place, Greenville, South Carolina**

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to engage in a general mercantile or merchandising business of any kind or character, and to that end to acquire, own, hold and dispose of any and all property of any nature; and to do any and all other acts necessary or incidental to the foregoing and to exercise all powers as may be permitted of corporations generally, or which may hereafter be permitted, under the laws of the State of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is **One Hundred (\$100.00)**-----Dollars payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is **One Hundred (100)** of the par value of **One (\$1.00) each**-----Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the **7th** day of **July**, 19 **61**, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

Andrew B. Marion and Fred D. Cox, Jr.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, **Andrew B. Marion** ;
as Vice-President, **Fred D. Cox, Jr.** ; as Secretary, **Fred D. Cox, Jr.** ;
as Treasurer, **Andrew B. Marion**

NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by *bona fide* subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in **Greenville Piedmont**

a newspaper published in the County of **Greenville**

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
