BEGINNING at an iron pin on the South side of Don Drive at joint front corner of lots 63 & 64 and runs thence with the line of lot no. 63, S 0-43 W 180 feet to an iron pin; thence N 76-41 W, 100 feet to an iron pin on the Northeast side of Buckingham Road; thence with the curve of Buckingham Road (the chord being N 29-59 W, 65 ft.) to an iron pin; thence with the curve of Buckingham Road and Don Drive (the chord being N 15-01 E, 35.3 ft.) to an iron pin on the South side of Don Drive; thence along Don Drive N 57-26 E, 92.9 ft. to an iron pin; thence with the curve of Don Drive (the chord being N70-36E, 49 ft.) to the beginning corner.
