CHARTER
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

O. B. Chapman, Greenville, South Carolina

and

James H. Campbell, Seneca, South Carolina

did on the 19th day of March, 1962, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is, NEW COLONIAL CLEANERS, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Green Acre Road, Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is operate and engage in the dry cleaning and laundering of clothes, cloth and wearing apparel of all kinds and types; to engage in the business of providing for services involving the maintenance, cleaning and repair, including reconstruction of cloth, merchandise and dry goods of various kinds and types and to do all things necessary to carry out the general purposes as herein stated.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00)-----Dollars payable on call of the Board of Directors

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One Hundred (100) shares of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) each-----Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 12th day of March, 1962, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: O. B. Chapman and James H. Campbell

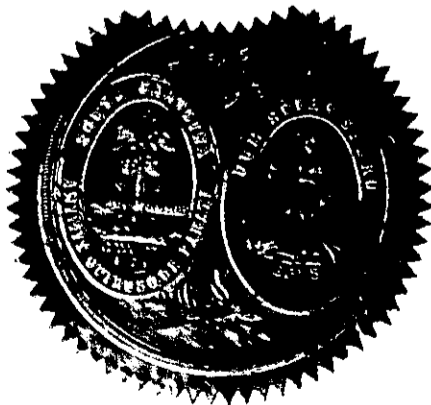
EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, James H. Campbell ; as Vice-President, O. B. Chapman ; as Secretary, James H. Campbell ; as Treasurer, James H. Campbell

NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Observer a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
