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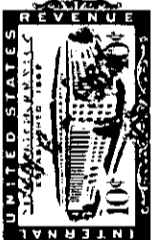

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That the Mauldin-Simpsonville Fountain Inn Water District, (a body corporate and political) created and existing by and under Act No. 559 of the Acts and Joint Resolutions of the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina, and certain amendments thereto, for and in consideration of the sum of EIGHTY EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY AND 18/100 (\$88,270.18) Dollars, to the Grantor in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by the Grantee (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the City of Greenville, South Carolina, its successors and assigns forever:



ALL water mains, pipe lines, valves, ~~hydrants~~ and appurtenances thereto and all easements and rights of way and all other properties owned by, in possession of, or claimed by the Grantor in the area of Greenville County, South Carolina, lying South of the Greenville, South Carolina City Limits, existing immediately prior to the election of September, 1961, and North of Interstate Highway No. I-85 and on both sides of U. S. Highway No. 276, which area is composed of Sections A, B, C, and D on map prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service, Greenville, South Carolina, entitled "North Index Map of Mauldin-Simpsonville-Fountain Inn Water District, Greenville and Laurens County, South Carolina", reference to which is hereby craved, and copies of which are filed in the offices of the Auditor and Treasurer of Greenville County; including but not limited to the following:



First - 9,869 feet, more or less, of pipe or water line sixteen (16) inches in diameter extending from Station 1 + 00 to Station 99 + 65 as shown on Black & Veatch plans of original installation, reference to which is hereby craved and made a part hereof, which point of termination is the limited access line on the North side of the interchange between Interstate Highway I-85 and U. S. Highway 276.

Second - 1,207 feet, more or less, of pipe or water line eight (8) inches in diameter and 2,400 feet, more or less, of pipe or water line six (6) inches in diameter located in the area known as Pleasantburg Industrial Park, Greenville, South Carolina.

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
