which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 3rd day of March, A. D. 1964, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That, at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That, the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than is above stated, nor for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the Greenville-Piedmont, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, Said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST: Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: The name of the proposed Corporation is **PAN AMERICAN CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION**

THIRD: The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville, S. C.
Mailing address: 16 Beattie Place, Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is

~~FOURTH. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation shall be the proclamation of the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ through any method or means that does not alter or disobey the teachings of the Scriptures; the defense of the faith of the Lord Jesus Christ against any person, group, ism,~~

or movement that opposes this faith; and the promotion of harmony and peace among fundamentalists Christian regardless of their denominational affiliation.

- (1) The association shall have the right and privilege to found and establish any institution or program desired by the Executive Committee to carry out this purpose.
- (2) The association shall not cooperate in the part or in the whole with any person, group, or movement that alter, change, or disobey the fundamental teachings of the scriptures.
- (3) The association shall not employ any person that cannot conscientiously be in accord with the purpose, statement of faith, and principles of this organization.
- (4) The purpose of the organization shall not be to make a profit that will inure to the benefit of any individual or group.

No individual or group shall receive any benefit in any matter whatsoever from the organization and operation of this non-profit corporation.
