KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that

William L. Brigham

in consideration of Five Hundred and 00/100 (\$500.00) ----- Dollars,

the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto Herman Dill, his heirs and assigns

One-half (1/2) of Lot 25-T of Springwood Cemetery, said lot having the following dimensions, to wit: North 8-1/4 feet, East 12 feet, South 8-1/4 feet, West 12 feet, for the right of burial and cemetery purposes, and to be used exclusively for the right and purpose aforesaid, and subject to the conditions of the Charter of the City of Greenville, and all revisions thereof and amendments that may be made thereto, and also subject to the ordinances of said city and the rules and regulations and By-Laws of the City Council and Cemetery Committee now in force or which may hereafter be passed relating to said cemetery and the burial of the dead therein.

Being the remaining one-half of the lot conveyed to Earle N. Rogers by the City Council of Greenville by deed dated April 14, 1944 and recorded on January 10, 1963 in the office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County in Deed Book 714, page 101.

The grantor also conveys to the grantee the right of ingress and egress to the above described lot over and through Lot No. 23-T, as conveyed to Grantor by Earle H. Rogers, for burial and cemetery purposes, provided, however, that the use and enjoyment of said right of way shall not interfere with the use and enjoyment by grantor, his heirs and assigns, or Lot No. 23-T for burial and cemetery purposes.

This is the same lot conveyed to grantor by deed of Earle H. Rogers and recorded in the Office of R.M.C. for Greenville County in Deed Book 733, Page 242.
