

NOW, Therefore, Know all men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred and no/100-----

to me paid by the said Administrator of Veterans' Affairs, an Officer of the United States of America, whose principal office and post office address is Veterans Administration, Washington 25, D. C., and his successors in such office, as such the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Administrator of Veterans' Affairs, an Officer of the United States of America, whose principal office and post office address is Veterans Administration, Washington 25, D. C., and his successors in such office, as such,

ALL that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, situate, lying and being on the Northeastern side of Meadow Crest Circle, near the City of Greenville, being shown and designated as Lot No. Twenty-Five (25) on a plat of North Meadow Heights made by Piedmont Engineering Service, dated 22 February, 1951, recorded in the RMC Office of Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book "W", at Page 183, and being more particularly described on a plat of Property of James W. Youngblood and Reba C. Youngblood, near Greenville, S.C. made by R. K. Campbell, dated February 20, 1963, recorded in the RMC Office of Greenville County, South Carolina in Plat Book "DDD", at Page 5, reference to said plat being craved for a complete and detailed description thereof.

Said lot fronts 75 feet along the Northeastern side of Meadow Crest Circle; runs to a depth of 167.3 feet on its Northwestern side; runs to a depth of 214.2 feet on its Southeastern side; and is 66 feet across its rear.
