KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that I, Ernest L. Hightower,

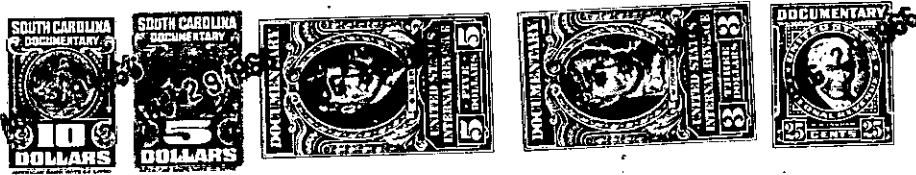
in consideration of Seven Thousand Two Hundred Fifty and No/100 (\$7,250.00)----- Dollars,
