GENERAL POWER OF ATTORNEY

Know all men by these presents; That I, Fred Muraview,
a legal resident of Union, State of New Jersey,
United States of America, now in the Armed Forces of the United States, as a
Captain with service number 05301080, presently serving over-
seas at APO 96318, San Francisco, California, have made, constitute and
appoint My wife, Rachel C. Muraview, Whose address is
2606 Anderson Road, Greenville, South Carolina, my true and lawful
attorney to act in, manage and conduct all my estate and all my affairs, and
for that purpose for me and in my name, place, and stead, and for my use and
benefit, and as my act and deed, to do and execute, or to concur with persons
jointly interested with myself therein the doing or executing of all or any of
the following acts, deeds, and things to wit:

1. To buy, receive, lease, accept, or otherwise acquire; to sell, convey,
mortgage, hypothecate, pledge, quit claim, or otherwise encumber or dispose of;
or to contract or agree for the acquisition, disposal, or encumbrance of any
property whatsoever of any custody, possession, interest, or right therein,
upon such terms, considerations, and conditions as my said attorney shall
think proper.

2. To take hold, possess, invest, lease, let, or otherwise manage any
or all of my property or interest therein, to eject, remove, store, transport,
repair, build on, raze, rebuild, alter, modify, or improve the same or any
part thereof, including the power to deliver my personal property into
Government storage in accordance with applicable regulations of the Department
of Defense and the armed service of which I am a member and to make, execute,
and deliver any applications, vouchers, or powers of attorney required by the
said regulations and in conformity therewith.

3. To make, do and transact all and every kind of business of whatsoever
nature, including the receipt, recovery, collection, payment, compromise,
settlement, and adjustment of all accounts, obligations, legacies, bequests,
interests, dividends, annuities, demands, debts, and taxes which may now or
hereafter be due, owing, or payable by me or to me.

4. To contract loans and borrow any sums of money in my name and upon
such terms as my said attorney shall see fit, and to pledge or give as
security therefore any or all of my said property.

5. To institute, prosecute, defend, compromise, arbitrate, and otherwise
fully dispose of legal, equitable, or administrative hearings, actions, suits,
attachments, arrests, distresses, or other proceedings, or otherwise engage
in litigation in connection with the premises and the powers herein granted
except that my said attorney shall not be authorized to accept service of
process from nor to submit me to the personal jurisdiction of any court as a
defendant in any suit or proceeding pending before the same without further
specific written authority on my part.

6. To act as my attorney or proxy in respect to any stocks, shares,
bonds or other investments, rights or interests which I may now or hereafter
hold.

7. To receive, collect, receipt for and to execute and deliver vouchers
in my behalf for any and all allowances and reimbursements properly payable
to me by the United States, by any state government or municipal authority,
and to receive, endorse, and collect checks payable to the order of the
undersigned drawn on the treasurer or other Fiscal Officer or depository of
the United States.

8. To take possession, and order the removal and shipment of my property
from any post, warehouse, depot, dock or other place of storage to safe keeping,
governmental or private; and to execute and deliver any release, voucher,
receipt, shipping ticket, certificate, or other instrument necessary or
convenient for such purpose.
