8. The general nature of the business for which the corporation is organized is (it is not necessary to set forth in the purposes powers enumerated in Section 2.2) (12-12.2 Supplemental Code 1962)

1. To acquire, build, own, maintain, and operate a professional and business office building with or without commercial facilities for the use of its shareholders and tenants and to lease space to its shareholders and tenants at a reasonable rental designed to be sufficient and or competitive to pay all rental and maintenance costs involved in the same.

2. To acquire real and personal property from time to time for investment and to develop the same for commercial purposes of any nature and kind whatsoever to include retail, wholesale and manufacturing; and, subdivisions and the various forms of land and building development.

9. Provisions which the incorporators elect to include in the articles of incorporation are as follows:

The initial investors and all others to whom stock may be sold shall agree as a condition of ownership among themselves that as to any shares allotted to them that they shall not transfer the same during their life time or as may be provided in the By-Laws without the previous consent in writing of all of the other parties hereto or the survivors of them, and only then to each other. The shareholders shall agree to reinvest any earnings from this Corporation for the first five (5) years into this Corporation unless waived in writing by all other shareholders of record.
