

R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book C at Page 176. Said property is the same two lots acquired by the grantor by deed recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 113 at Page 93.

The within deed is being executed for the following purposes:

1. To consolidate the legal descriptions of the church property that was acquired during different periods of time by deeds referred to above, ~~into~~ one composite description showing the church property, and also showing the property of the church that is used as its manse.
2. To show that the legal owner of all of said property is not an unincorporated association as may be inferred by some of the deeds referred to above but rather that the owner of said property is a South Carolina eleemosynary corporation organized and chartered on March 19, 1892, which charter was filed of record on April 2, 1892 in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. WW at Page 763.
3. To state as a public record that the local church known as The Second Presbyterian Church of Greenville is the absolute owner in fee simple of the properties described herein.
4. To state as a public record that the charter of The Second Presbyterian Church of Greenville has been amended by defining with more precision the purpose of the church and its unchanging principles, which amendment of charter has been duly recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 817, at Page 93, reference to which is hereby craved.
