C O N T R A C T

STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA )

COUNTY OF GREENVILLE )

THIS AGREEMENT made the 24th day of July in the year Nineteen Hundred Sixty-Seven, by and between W. V. McGrew & Sons, hereinafter called the Contractor, and The Greater Greenville Sewer District, hereinafter called the Owner, WITNESSETH, that whereas the Owner intends to remove overburden from existing sewer lines in the Reedy River Drainage Basin, on Mr. Loudermilk's property at the intersection of Cleveland Street and Reedy River.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the Owner for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

THE WORK TO BE DONE

The Contractor agrees to provide a crane, a crane operator, a helper, general supervision and to do all things necessary for the proper execution and completion of the above referenced project.

THE CONTRACTOR'S DUTIES AND STATUS

The Contractor recognizes the relations of trust and confidence established between him and the Owner by this Agreement. He covenants with the Owner to furnish his best skill and judgment and to cooperate in forwarding the interests of the Owner. He agrees to furnish efficient business administration and superintendence, and to use every effort to keep upon the work at all times an adequate supply of workmen and materials, and to secure its execution in the best and soundest way and in the most expeditious and economical manner consistent with the interests of the Owner.

FEE FOR SERVICE

In consideration of the performance of the Contract, the Owner agrees to pay the Contractor in current funds, as compensation for his service, fees, based on the actual work done at a unit price of \$14.00 per hour for the services as outlined in the above paragraph entitled "The Work to Be Done". Fees shall be paid monthly on the basis of work completed.

CONTRACTOR'S FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

Any cost due to the negligence of the Contractor or anyone directly employed by him, either for the making good of defective work,
