KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That we, Charles C. King, Robert D. King, Cindy K. Brackett, Victoria K. Clayton, Emma K. Solesbee, Leora K. Brackett, Broadus L. King, Flora K. Clayton and Ruby K. Rumsey,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of: One (\$1.00) and the premises

to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents
 by Troy King

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Troy King and his
 heirs and assigns forever:

All of our right, title and interest in and to:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Highland Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, lying on the north side of the King Road and on the waters of Middle Tyger River, having the following courses and distances:

BEGINNING at a stake at the corner of grantee's other lands, and runs thence N. 14-06 W. 1107.5 feet to a stone in the Forrester line; thence S. 75-32 W. 947.8 feet to a stone; thence S. 14-05 E. 646.8 feet to a stone in hollow; thence S. 31-30 W. 155.1 feet to a stone on the northeast side of road; thence S. 16-30 E. 370.3 feet to a stone; thence S. 60-15 E. 148.5 feet to a stone; thence S. 14-30 E. 174.2 feet to a stake at corner of grantee's other lands; thence N. 58-45 E. 982.7 feet to the beginning, containing 28.42 acres, more or less. See plat made for Troy King by J. Q. Bruce, Surveyor, dated August 15, 1967, to be recorded herewith.

On February 22, 1936, R. H. King conveyed to the grantee the above described tract of land, but through inadvertence or error the Habendum Clause in said deed was not filled out. This deed is executred by the grantors, the sole heirs at law of R. H. King and Rebecca King, his wife, for the purpose of Quit-Claiming and conveying to the grantee all interes, if any, inherited by us from R. H. and Rebecca King,—both of whom died intestate. .
