KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One and no/100 and the  
 Consideration of placing title in the name of the present church ~~XXXXX~~  
 to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents  
 by Enoree Baptist Church

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by  
 these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Deacons of ENOREE  
 BAPTIST CHURCH, their Successors and assigns forever:

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina on the northern side of Tigerville Road, bounded  
 by Ford L. McAlister on the West and Nix on the North, and by Blue  
 Ridge Circle on the East and Tigerville Road on the south, and being  
 composed of two tracts, as follows:

1. A two and one-quarter acres more or less - Beginning at a rock in  
 the road, and running thence N 62- $\frac{1}{2}$  W 6.60 chains (435.6 feet);  
 thence N 6- $\frac{1}{2}$  W 2.18 chains (143.88 feet); thence S 89- $\frac{1}{2}$  E 6.80 chains  
 (448.8 feet); thence S 13 E 5.31 chains (350.46 feet) to the beginning.  
 This is the same property described in deed book W, page 623.
2. A two and one-half acres more or less - Beginning at a red oak and  
 running thence N 8 W 2.98 chains (196.68 feet); thence S 83 E 8.31  
 chains (548.46 feet); thence S 4- $\frac{1}{2}$  E 2.70 chains (178.2 feet); thence  
 N 89 W 5.41 chains (357.06 feet); thence N 12- $\frac{1}{2}$  W 0.48 chains (31.68  
 feet); thence N 87 W 2.96 chains (195.36 feet) to the point of be-  
 ginning, and is the same described in deed book XX, page 742.

The purpose of this deed is to correct the name of the church. Formerly  
 it was known as Enoree Church, but is now known as Enoree Baptist Church.

A new survey of the within two described tracts, together with a third  
 tract (from Ford L. McAlsiter in deed book 631, page 495) is being  
 placed on record, giving an up to date survey of the entire property of  
 said Church.
