NOW THEREFORE, I, Feddie Perkins, hereinafter referred to as Grantor, in consideration of the sum of \$1.00, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, paid to me by, and love and affection for Mable Perkins hereby grant, bargain, sell and release to said Mable Perkins, her heirs and assigns:

All my right, title and interest in and to that piece, parcel or lot of land situtate in the County of Greenville, state of South Carolina, and in the Sixth Ward of the City of Greenville, and fronting on the west side of Douglas Street forty-eight (48) feet with a depth of one hundred seven (107) feet, with the back or western line forty (40) feet, and bounded now or formerly as follows: On the north by Lillie and Ned Miller, on the east by Douglas Street, on the west by W. R. Sowall and on the south by J. C. Milford.

This being the same property conveyed to Orange Perkins, John Perkins and others by deed of J. C. Milford dated of December 1922, and recorded in Book of Deeds 87 at page 220.

TOGETHER with all and Singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all am singular the said premises before mentioned unto the Grantee hereinabove named, and her Heirs and Assigns forever.
