Kilby hereafter referred to as Grantee, at and before the sealing of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Grantee Harry E. Kilby, his heirs and assigns

All my right, title and interest in that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville, County, State of South Carolina being known and designated as lots numbered nineteen (19) and twenty (20) on plat of New Hope, said plat being recorded in Plat Book "A" at page 307, each of said lots having a frontage of fifty-seven and one-half feet on Cobb Street, and running back on parallel lines one hundred and fifty feet, the east line of lot #20 being on Miller Street, and being the same lots of land conveyed to W. F. Kilby by H. F. Tumblin, by deed dated July 12, 1919, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Volume 44, page 610. Less, however, Lot #20 sold to J.B. Wilson by W.F. Kilby by deed in Deed Book 430 at 449.

Also, all my right, title and interest in that other certain piece, parcel and lot of land situate, lying and being in County and State aforesaid about two miles west of the City of Greenville in a subdivision known as New Hope and designated as Lot No. 18 in a plat of said division, said plat being recorded in Office of R.M.C. for Greenville County, in plat Book "A", at page 307, and being the same lot of land conveyed to W. F. Kilby by H. F. Tumblin, by deed dated July 12, 1919, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Volume 44, page 610.

This being all my right, title and interest which my mother (Sallie Mae Kilby Crowe), inherited from her father W. F. Kilby who died intestate in 1958 and whose estate will be found probated in Apartment 686, File 20 in the office of the Probate Judge for Greenville County, South Carolina. Sallie Mae Kilby Crowe died intestate after the death of her father W. F. Kilby.

TOGETHER with all and Singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the Grantee and Grantee's Heirs/Successors and Assigns forever. AND Grantor does hereby bind Grantor and Grantor's Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto Grantee and Grantee's Heirs/Successors and Assigns against Grantor and Grantor's Heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
