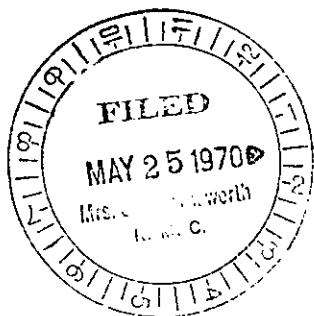

 acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell and release  
 unto the said John C. Blount,

All those certain pieces, parcels or lots of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, designated as Lots numbers 1530 and 1531 on plat No. F. J. of the Property of Tryon Development Company, known as Lake Lanier, prepared by George Kershaw, C. E., recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County in Plat Book G at page 53, and having the courses and distances shown on said plat.

This property was conveyed to Mae F. Cannon by Tryon Development Company by a deed dated June 26, 1926, and recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 121 at page 85. Mae F. Cannon died intestate on March 9, 1952, leaving as her sole heirs at law Corrie C. Hardy and Effie C. Thatcher.

Effie C. Thatcher conveyed her undivided one-half interest in said property to Corrie C. Hardy by a certain deed recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County on June 28, 1957, in Deed Book 579 at Page 329.

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
