

Bryan Verdin, or other parties, by a separate written agreement, which agreement will cover all or substantially all of the 519 acres covered by the Lease Agreement and Lessee agrees that any such parties to such management agreement shall have the right to use so much of the 519 acres not actually being used by the Lessee for the purpose of land fill and disposal of waste as provided in the Lease Agreement subject to the paramount right of the Lessee to utilize the various plots of the demised premises in a consecutive and orderly fashion and manner and subject to the right of access to each such plot or plots upon which the Lessee may currently be using or restoring after use. After commencing work on plot number 1 of the demised premises the Lessee agrees to give to the Lessor and to any other parties to any management agreement 120 days written notice of the next plot to be actually used by the Lessee and the proposed time of entry by the Lessee upon the next plot and upon receipt of such notice the Lessee and any other party to any management agreement will give possession of such plot to the Lessee at the time noted for such entry. After each plot has been completely filled, covered, terraced, graded, and seeded, possession of each of the same will automatically revert to the Lessor and/or to any other party to a management agreement entered into by the Lessor and the Lessee shall have no further rights thereto or therein.

3. BUILDINGS: It is understood and agreed that the Lessee will provide fire insurance on any building actually on the demised premises provided such building is insurable.

Lessee agrees to furnish full cooperation and render proper assistance in the prevention and controlling and extinguishment of any grass, brush or forest fire or other hostile fire which may occur on or threaten the demised premises.
