C O N T R A C T

THIS AGREEMENT made the 10th day of February in the year Nineteen Hundred Seventy-one, by and between A. R. Wood Company, hereinafter called the Contractor, and the Greenville County Sewer Authority hereinafter called the Owner.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Contractor and the Owner for the consideration herein after named, agree as follows:

THE WORK TO BE DONE

SEWERS AND APPURTENANCES: The Contractor shall construct the sewers shown on the plans, together with all clearing, grubbing, excavating, sheathing, backfilling, manholes, and other appurtenances as shown on the plans or specified. The material will be furnished by the Owner.

EXCAVATION IN SOLID ROCK: Solid rock shall consist of such material in the original bed or well defined ledges which cannot be removed with pick and shovel, ditching machine, backhoe or other similar devices and which requires drilling and blasting or the use of jack hammers or bullpoints. Boulders or detached pieces of rock having a volume of eight (8) cubic feet or larger shall also be considered as rock.

INFILTRATION: The allowable limit of leakage of groundwater into the line will not exceed the following rates of infiltration:

- (a) 0.25 gallons per inch diameter per foot of pipe per day for a line between manholes.
- (b) 0.15 gallons per inch diameter per foot of pipe per day for any sewer, or sewer system, one mile or less in length.

MANHOLES: Manholes will be constructed at such points as may be designated by the plans and instructions given. The bottom of each standard brick manhole will be built of class "B" concrete and the walls will be built of whole, hard burned brick. Outside walls of manholes will be plastered with a coat of cement mortar made with 75% Protland and 25% Pouzzlan cement.

THE CONTRACTOR'S DUTIES AND STATUS

The Contractor recognizes the relations of trust and confidence established between him and the Owner by this Agreement. He covenants with the Owner to furnish his best skill and judgement and to cooperate in forwarding the interests of the Owner. He agrees to furnish efficient business administration and superintendence, and to use every effort to keep upon the work at all times an adequate supply of workmen and materials, and to secure its execution in the best and soundest way and in the most expeditious and economical manner consistent with the interests of the Owner.

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
