

Wiswall plat which is recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book Y at Pages 114 et. seq. this last line has a bearing of N. 76-45 W. and a distance of 58.87 chains.

The second tract is part of a tract granted to George W. Julian by the State of South Carolina on July 6, 1854 and according to plat prepared by John Bowen on December 11, 1853, recorded in Location Book DD at Page 77, this tract contained approximately 198 acres. However, on the Wiswall plat which is recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book Y at Pages 114 et. seq. this tract is shown as a tract of 152 acres, and that is accepted as the correct acreage. The 152-acre tract was divided in the year 1944 so that the Piedmont Corporation received from T. J. Wilson, et al. the southernmost 76 acres and the said T. J. Wilson received the 76 acres adjacent to the North Carolina-South Carolina State line. These deeds are recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 308 at Page 322 and in Deed Vol. 274 at Page 383.

James L. Ambler conveyed an undivided one-half interest in the 152-acre tract to W. A. Gilreath by deed dated April 18, 1905 and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 000 at Page 119 and the said W. A. Gilreath conveyed said interest to O. P. Mills by deed dated January 15, 1914, recorded in Deed Vol. 16 at Page 139. The executors and beneficiaries of the O. P. Mills Estate conveyed to Anne M. Moore by the aforementioned deed dated March 7, 1940 and recorded in Deed Vol. 222 at Page 98. The said Anne M. Moore conveyed said interest to Piedmont Corporation by aforementioned deed dated March 16, 1940 and recorded in Deed Vol. 222 at Page 41. The other one-half interest was conveyed by Nancy Galloway to George W. Wilson by deed dated November 28, 1906 and recorded in Deed Vol. MMM at Page 781.
