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pay all ordinary and necessary living expenses such as utilities, insurance premiums, mortgage payments, medical bills, Federal, State and local taxes and other similar personal expenses.

(b) To pay over to my wife, Frances Wever Turrentine, \$85.00 per week for miscellaneous household expenses and personal needs—further, to pay to or for my wife's benefit such other sums as in the sole discretion of my trustee are necessary and required for her support and maintenance.

2 (c) Any income which the trustee in its sole discretion shall determine is not needed for the above purposes shall be accumulated and reinvested by the trustee. The trustee shall use its best judgment in this respect and shall not be responsible for errors of judgment made in good faith.

(d) Upon the death of the grantor, the trustee shall transfer all of the property then held under this trust, together with any undistributed income to the executor or administrator of the grantor's estate, as the case may be, to be distributed as a part thereof.

THIRD: The grantor reserves the power to revoke this trust in its entirety by an instrument in writing filed with the trustee at least thirty days prior to the effective date of such revocation.

FOURTH: The trustee may resign this trusteeship at any time by giving thirty (30) days written notice delivered to the grantor in person or mailed to his last known address, the resignation to become effective at the end of the thirty (30) days from the time the notice was delivered in person or mailed to the grantor. The grantor shall appoint as successor trustee some bank or trust company qualified to do business in the state.

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
