

Also. (7) All that piece or parcel of land containing 2 84/100 acres, more or less, as per survey made by G. A. Ellis, Surveyor, dated June 10, 1946 and having the following metes and bounds: Beginning at a point 200 feet from Alverson corner on the Belton Highway, thence S. 88E. 215 feet to a corner on line of Lot #1, thence N. 22 E. 266.6 feet to corner thence N. 9W. 209 feet, to corner of old road, thence N. 83W. 223 feet to point on West side of Belton Highway, thence with said highway 484 feet to beginning corner. This being the identical property conveyed to Eulas E. Reese and Lethia O. Reese by deed of Clarence Owens recorded in Deed Book 673 at page 193 in the office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County.

Also. (8) That certain piece or parcel of land containing 7.3 acres, more or less, as per survey made by G. A. Ellis, Surveyor, dated June 10, 1946 and having the following metes and bounds: Beginning at the corner of Lot No. 6 in the McKelvy Road, thence North 920 feet to corner of Lot No. 6; thence S. 83E. 396 feet to corner of lot No. 8, thence with the line of Lot No. 8, S 5 1/2 W. 780 feet to corner in McKelvy Road; thence S 60W. 376 feet to the beginning corner. This is the identical property conveyed to Eulas E. Reese and Lethia O. Reese by deed of Clarence Owens recorded in Deed Book 673 at page 177 in the office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County.

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And for the consideration aforesaid, the Grantors do further grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the Grantee, its successors and assigns, for the period of One (1) year from the date hereof, full, complete and unqualified rights to enter, in, upon, through and over all parts of the above described lands for the purpose of cutting, manufacturing, removing and transporting through and over the same, the said trees and timber herein granted, provided however, that should all of the timber herein conveyed be not removed within a period of One (1) year from the date of this instrument the Grantee shall be given permission in writing by the Grantors to have an additional period of six (6) months after the date of expiration of the first one (1) year period to cut and remove such timber still not cut provided the Grantee pays the Grantor six (6%) per cent of the value of the uncut timber for such privilege. Timber not cut and removed within the time stated shall revert to the Grantors.

The Grantee shall have the right to construct, operate and maintain necessary roads over the forest area of the lands and extending to the main

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
