

POWER OF ATTORNEY

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, DOROTHY B. JUDY, of Grants Pass, Oregon, the wife of William S. Judy, have made, constituted and appointed and by these presents do make, constitute and appoint MRS. DAISY S. JUDY of Greenville, South Carolina, my true and lawful attorney, for me and in my name, place and stead and for my use and benefit:

1. To make, execute, sign and deliver in my name and renounce in favor of Landel Properties, a limited partnership, its successors and assigns, all of my dower right and interest which I now have or hereafter may have in the following described real property:

A plot of land in the State of South Carolina, Greenville County, City of Greenville, lying at the eastern intersection of North Street and William Street, and being the northern portion of Lot 1 of Block 7, as shown on a plat of Boyce Addition, dated January 13, 1904, located in Plat Book A, page 90.

2. To execute the said written renunciation to dower and all my dower rights in the real property described in paragraph 1 above, according to and in full compliance with the laws of South Carolina.

I hereby give and grant unto my said attorney in fact full power and authority freely to do and perform every act and thing whatsoever requisite and necessary to be done in and about the premises, as fully to all intents and purposes as I might or could do if personally present, hereby ratifying and confirming all that my said attorney in fact shall lawfully do or cause to be done by virtue hereof.

I further expressly state and declare that I execute this Power of Attorney privately and separate and apart from my husband, William S. Judy; that I execute the same freely and voluntarily to carry out my own wishes and desires.
