That certain parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Chick Springs Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in the City of Greer, on the northwest corner of the intersection of McDade Avenue and Roe Street, being known and designated as Lot No. 1 on a plat of property prepared for Nancy Finley by H. S. Brockman, Surveyor, dated June 17, 1947, recorded in Plat Book T at Page 215, and having such metes and bounds as thereby shown. According to said plat, said lot fronts 112.8 feet on the north side of McDade Avenue and 163 feet on the west side of Roe Street, with a depth of 150 feet on the west and 49 feet on the north.
