

In the event of a conflict between the summary contained in this paragraph XIII and the provisions of Appendix Four, Appendix Four will govern.

XIV. STRUCTURAL CHANGES, EXTERIOR CHANGES AND ADDITIONS. Whenever it is desired that structural changes or additions be made to the common areas and facilities, the following provisions will control:

- A. Required vote. If the vote to make any such change or addition is at least 75% or more of the total vote of the Association, the proposed change or addition shall be made, and the cost thereof shall be borne by the residence owners in their respective percentages of undivided interest in the common areas and facilities.
- B. Excessive additional cost. If the cost of such change or addition is greater than 3% of the total value of the property in condominium, any residence owner who votes against the change or addition but was required to bear a proportionate amount of the cost may require the Association to buy his residence at a fair price. The term "total value" means the value determined by an appraisal of the whole condominium including residences and common area and facilities and without deduction on account of debts secured thereby, conducted by an appraiser designated by the Greenville Real Estate Board, which appraisal will be at the expense of dissenting residence owners. The term "fair price" shall be the fair market value of the residence owner's residence determined by an appraisal conducted by an appraiser designated by the Greenville Real Estate Board at the evenly shared expense of the Association and the dissenting residence owner. In the event that the Greenville Real Estate Board ceases to exist, or fails or refuses to designate an appraiser within a reasonable time in the manner herein contemplated, such appraisals shall be conducted by a real estate
