**AFFIDAVIT** 

COUNTY OF GREENVILLE

PERSONALLY appeared before me William Harold Hammett, who first being duly sworn, deposes and says that he is one of the direct descendents of Frances Davis Hammett, who was the owner of Tract No. 2 containing 104 acres, more or less, and Tract No. 3, containing 124 acres, more or less, surveyed at the request of the heirs of John F. Hammett as is more fully shown on the plats attached hereto and made a part hereof. That said Frances Davis Hammett died on or about the year 1884, leaving a will devising said property to her son, John P. Hammett. That said will was never filed of record in the Probate Court for Greenville County but that said John P. Hammett went into possession of said property and occupied it until his death on August 12, 1926. That John P. Hammett left as his sole heirs-at-law his widow, Jennie Hammett and his children, E. E. Hammett, Helen H. Hudson, and Eula Hammett. That said heirs made a voluntary partition of the property owned by John P. Hammett and that Eula Hammett received as her share of the property 156.65 acres as is more fully shown in the Office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 646, at Page 261. That said Eula Hammett went into possession of said premises on September 7, 1939 and continued in possession until her death November 27, 1957.
