WHEREAS, the remaining children of James E. Coleman and the beneficiary of Eddie Eugene Coleman are desirous of effecting a division of the property of James E. Coleman as provided in his Will,

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Annie Ruth Coleman and Flora Beatrice Coleman and their heirs and assigns forever:

All that lot of land located in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Oneal Township, about eight miles northwest of Greer, on the southeast side of Darby Road, containing 14 acres, more or less, as shown on a survey entitled "Property of James E. Coleman Estate" dated December 12, 1974, by W. R. Williams, Jr., Surveyor, to be recorded herewith, and having, according to said plat, the following netes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a nail and cap in center of Darby Road (iron pin back at 35.7 feet) and running thence N. 88-00 E. 279.1 feet to an old iron pin, corner with Chasteen and Edwards; thence with Edwards line S. 20-40 E. 1092.3 feet to an iron pin, corner with Edwards and Batson; thence with Batson line S. 58-18 W. 358 feet to an iron pin; thence N. 36-41 W. 1133.7 feet to a nail and cap in center of Darby Road (iron pin back at 25 feet); thence with center of Darby Road as line the following courses and distances: N. 34-21 E. 60 feet, N. 39-23 E. 50 feet, N. 43-01 E. 50 feet, N. 47-23 E. 50 feet, N. 53-45 E. 224.3 feet to the beginning point.
