McAbee, James Herman and William E. Prince, as Trustees of Brandon Baptist Church, their successors in office, and assigns:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land with the improvements thereon situate, lying and being in the Brandon Mill Community of Greater Greenville, County of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, located on the West side of Jones Street and adjacent to The Abney Foundation Bowling Alley and Skating Rink, and commonly referred to as the Scout House Property, being more fully described as follows:
