in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two Thousand, Five Hundred  
and no/100-----(\$2,500.00)----- Dollars

to her in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents  
by George W. Vaughn and Jacqueline P. Vaughn

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by  
these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said George W. Vaughn and  
Jacqueline P. Vaughn, their heirs and assigns forever;

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, lying and being on the North side of

Carolina Avenue, near the City of Greenville, known and designated  
as Lot No. 11 of Block K of Section No. 5 on plat of East Highland  
Estates, made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, February, 1941, recorded  
in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book  
K, at pages 78, 79 and 80, and having according to said plat, the  
following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the south side of Carolina Avenue, joint  
front corner of Lots No. 9 and 11 of Block K, and running thence with  
the line of Lot No. 9, N. 7-13 W. 170 feet to an iron pin on the South  
side of a 5 foot strip reserved for utilities; thence with the South  
side of said strip, S. 82-47 W. 70 feet to an iron pin, joint rear  
corner of Lots No. 11 and 13; thence with the line of Lot No. 13,  
S. 7-13 E. 170 feet to an iron pin on the North side of Carolina  
Avenue; thence with the North side of Carolina Avenue, N. 82-47 E.  
70 feet to the beginning corner.

This is the same property conveyed to Icey Thompson by deed recorded  
in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, on the  
12th day of December, 1941 in Deed Book 240, at page 155. Mrs. Icey  
Thompson died intestate, a resident of Rabun County, Georgia, in  
1970, leaving as her sole heirs at law her husband, Fred Thompson,  
and her children, Ruth Darnell, Blanche Lovell, Harold Thompson,  
Faye Moore, Cordelia Cannon and Etrulia Hooper. Mr. Fred Thompson  
died intestate in 1971, leaving as his sole heirs at law, his  
children named above.
