LEASE AGREEMENT WITH OPTION TO PURCHASE

THIS AGREEMENT, executed this Tit day of May, 1975, by and between R. MITCHELL PAIGE, AND ROBERT MANGUM, hereinafter referred to as "lessors", and W. C. WALDREP, hereinafter referred to as "lessee",

WITNESSETH:

The Lessors do hereby lease and demise unto the Lessee, and the Lessee does hereby lease and take as tenant:

to have and to hold unto the Lessee for and during the term beginning May 7, 1975, and ending at midnight on May 7, 1976.

In consideration of this lease, the parties hereto for themselves, their representatives and assigns, do covenant and agree as follows:

1. That on the execution of this lease the Lessees will have paid the sum of Six Hundred Forty-three and 44/100 (\$643.44) Dollars, in advance, said sum representing rental for the first (1st) and twelfth (12th) months of this lease; that by executing this agreement, Lessors acknowledge receipt of the above sum of Six Hundred Forty-three and 44/100 (\$643.44) Dollars; that the parties hereto further agree that the rental for the twelfth month is to be held as security during the term of this lease, and in the event of a breach by lessee of any condition or term of this lease, that the sum of Three Hundred Twenty-one and 72/100 (\$321.72) Dollars representing the rental payment for the twelfth month , shall be applied to remedy any damages which the lessors may suffer by such breach by lessee.

2. The the lessee will pay to the lessors as a rental for the use of the leased premises the sum of Three Hundred Twenty-one and 72/100 (\$321.72) Dollars per month each month during the term of this lease, with said rental payments becoming
