the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto

William Edward Black and Bernice C. Black, their heirs and assigns:

All that lot of land in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, in O'Neal Township, on the southern side of Jackson Grove Road, sometimes referred to as McElhaney Road, shown as two acres on plat of Mrs. W. E. Black and children, recorded in the R.M.C. Office in plat book 5-0 page 64 and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the southern side of Jackson Grove Road, also known as McElhaney Road, at the corner of property this day being conveyed to the grantees by deed of Ella Hester Black, et al., and running thence S 24-10 W 211 feet to an iron pin; thence S 75-12 E 330 feet to an iron pin; thence N 14-25 E 208.6 feet, more or less, to an iron pin in the center of Jackson Grove Road, thence with center of said road N 74-48 W 284.7 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning, which is at or near the center of the road.
