Said tract containing 53.73 acres and being shown and designated as Tract No. 3 on plat entitled property of Cornelia Howard G. Langford Estate, dated June 24, 1976, by W. R. Williams, Jr., and having according to said plat the following metes and bounds to-wit:

BEGINNING at a spike in the center of Jackson Grove Road which is located at the northwestern corner of Tract No. 4 on the ?bove referred to plat, and running thence with the line of Trace No. 4 S. 21-26 W. 225 feet to an iron pin on the southern edge of Jackson Grove Road; thence continuing with the line of Tract No. 4 S. 21-26 W. 2986.1 feet to an iron pin near the northern bank of Beaver Dam Creek; thence continuing S. 21-26 W. 25 feet to a point in the center of said creek; thence with Beaver Dam Creek as the line, the traverse lines of which are N. 50-27 W. 119 feet to a point; thence N. 53-03 W. 485 feet to a point; thence N. 81-36 W. 195.9 feet to a point; thence leaving the center of said creek and running in a northerly direction 25 feet more or less to an old iron pin near the northern bank of said creek at the corner of property now or formerly owned by Hart; thence with the line of said Hart property N. 30-29 W. 246 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing with the line of said Hart property N. 36-46 E. 212.8 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing with the line of said Hart property N. 27-22 E. 2376.2 feet to an iron pin; thence continuing N. 27-22 E. 142.5 feet to an iron pin on the southern edge of Jackson Grove Road; thence continuing N. 27-22 E. 25 feet to a spike in the center of Jackson Grove Road which is also the center of the intersection of Jackson Grove Road and Pine Log Ford Road; thence with the center line of Jackson Grove Road S. 63-41 E. 82.3 feet to a point; thence S. 65-32 E. 125 feet to a point; thence S. 66-48 E. 100 feet to a point; thence S. 69-08 E. 100 feet to a point; thence S. 71-56 E. 100 feet to a point; thence S. 73-14 E. 139 feet to a spike in the center of Jackson Grove Road being the point of beginning, and being a portion of the property conveyed to J. P. Gilreath by deed recorded on the 1st day of March, 1922, in Deed Book 79, Page 284, Greenville County RMC Office. Said land was subsequently devised to Cornelia Howard Gilreath by Will of J. P. Gilreath dated February 15, 1937, admitted to Probate on August 7, 1947, by the Greenville County Probate Court, and said Will is on file in the records of said Court in Apartment 533 at File 3. Cornelia Howard Gilreath subsequently married Marcus Clardy Langford. She died on February 25, 1976, leaving a Will dated July 11, 1975, which was admitted to Probate in the Greenville County Probate Court and a copy is contained in the records of said Court in Apartment 1416 at File 30. The above described property is conveyed to the grantee herein pursuant to Item V of said Last Will and Testament.

This conveyance is made subject to existing easements, restrictions and rights-of-way upon or affecting said property.
