The Court has reviewed the Affidavit of Default filed by the attorney for the plaintiffs and has reviewed the Affidavits of personal service and the Court finds and concludes that the defendants are in default and does further find and conclude that the plaintiffs are entitled to the relief sought in their verified Complaint.

The Court further finds and concludes that the plaintiffs properly represent themselves and a class united in interest, such class being the Heirs at Law of Julia Ponder, now deceased.

The Court further finds that the said Julia Ponder died intestate on April 16, 1940 seized and possessed of a tract of land containing approximately seventy-five (75) acres, located in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, which is now shown and designated as Lot 10, Block 1, Sheet 619.2 of the tax maps of Greenville County, South Carolina and that the plaintiffs and the class they represent hold fee simple title to said property by and through the said Julia Ponder. The Court further finds that the said seventyfive (75) acre tract of land was initially a part of a larger tract containing five hundred sixty-two (562) acres, more or less, owned by A. J. Ponder, now deceased, and being shown on a plat of property made of the Estate of A. J. Ponder on August 4, 1874, by J. K. Dixon, Surveyor, and that the plat of the larger tract clearly shows a road leading across property now owned by the defendants to and into the tract of land now owned by the plaintiffs and the class which they represent. The Court further finds that the property of the plaintiffs and the property of the defendants once belonged
