

Subsidiary Corporations; and all and singular, the rights, privileges, powers and franchises of each of the Subsidiary Corporations, and all property, real, personal and mixed, and all debts due to any of the Subsidiary Corporations on whatever account, as well for stock subscriptions as all other things in action or belonging to each of the Subsidiary Corporations, shall be vested in the Parent Corporation; and all property, rights, privileges, powers and franchises, and all and every other interest shall be thereafter as effectually the property of the Parent Corporation as they were of the several and respective Subsidiary Corporations, and the title to any real or personal property, whether by deed or otherwise vested in any of the Subsidiary Corporations, shall not revert or be in any way impaired by reason of the merger; provided, however, that all rights of creditors and all liens upon any property of any of the Subsidiary Corporations shall be preserved unimpaired, and all debts, liabilities and duties of the respective Subsidiary Corporations shall thenceforth attach to the Parent Corporation and may be enforced against it to the same extent as if said debts, liabilities and duties had been incurred or contracted by the Parent Corporation.
