The roadways, and walkways which are the property of the Corporation are to be used new means of ingress and egress to the cemetery and to the lots and stations and lot entrance into the cemetery, or other means of ingress or egress.

All persons visiting and in the cemetery shall respect the solemnity of the cemetery and no loud noise or disturbance conduct itself between any roads, walkways, parkways, or any portion of the cemetery.

A visitor shall touch nothing in the cemetery that does not belong to him.

Visitors to Glendale Cemetery, who are not members of the funeral procession, are required, not to intrude upon a funeral or in honor about an open grave.

Entrance to and exit from the cemetery by vehicle or otherwise shall be by way of the regular established entrances which vehicles shall not pass in funeral procession, nor shall this funeral be closely followed, or joined by persons who are strangers. It is not an occasion for this ceremony.

Vehicles are not to turn around upon any of the roads, but should follow one of the circular driveways to their destination. They shall keep on the right and when they stop shall be at least six inches from the lawn.

4. MAINTENANCE, MUSEUMS AND EXHIBITIONS

Vaults shall be built only in that part of the cemetery designated for same by the Corporation and only upon receipt of notification from the duly authorized officers of the Corporation. The said vaults must be furnished with shelves, brackets, elevations, adjustable intervals, to be separately made and especially suitable, and all ornaments and all parts of vaults above ground shall be of marine grade, or other cast stone.

All foundations for monuments are to be laid by the cemetery authorities at no extra cost to the corporation, and the laying of the foundation shall be done by the employees of the Corporation, and under the supervision of the Superintendent, and completed as rapidly as possible.

No individual marker or headstone shall be placed above ground level, except when permission is obtained by the corporation, and then, only in the event it is considered in keeping with marking markers.

All monuments placed in mortuaries must be removed from the mortuaries. Stone and brick may be left in mortuaries, however, minimum base size 12' x 12', maximum base height including top 4' 6", maximum base size 12' x 12', maximum base height including top 4' 6", maximum height including base 32'. Maximum height of 36' is to be permitted at Section 2 and the Northern half-section of Section 3, and other sections which are developed may be classed and restricted.

Stone slabs will not be permitted, either cast or field stones.

All stone and iron work, monuments and headstones to be accepted by the Superintendent as being in accordance with the foregoing rules, before being taken into the cemetery material of any kind will be rejected at the cemetery gate on Sunday after 12 o'clock noon. When monuments, headstones, etc., are placed upon any lot held, no removal of same will be permitted to the墓主 under claim that they are not his, unless other provision, without the authority of the cemetery corporation.

No monument is to be placed until the lot has been paid for and only after the payment has been made, except to the office of the cemetery for interment.

Individual markers will be placed at each end of the lot, family monuments with be placed on the upper portion of the lot, as shown on detail plan of the cemetery lots. No family monument, even the most costly, can be erected unless the lot owner has payment in full.

b. FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES

This Corporation avows to raise funds for the cemetery, in view of all lots purchased after November 1, 1947. These funds will be used for the construction to provide shade trees, flower beds, lawns, flowers, shrubs, trees and to keep the cemetery in good condition.

and furnish all headstone, columbarium and other structures, monuments, headstones, curbstones, or other stone work in the cemetery, and will not require or replace same, or cancellation of this Corporation for any unusual expense to the funds available from such trust fund.

Glendale Cemetery will take reasonable precautions to protect the property of lot or any avenue, property in this cemetery, or house or damage, but distinctly disclaimer responsibility for any loss or damage, whether direct or indirect, from the acts of third parties, including, but not limited to, cyclone, fire, lightning, all kinds of providence including especially winds, tornados, variable winds and sudden, short, sharp winds, or cyclone, hail, snow, frost, fire, explosion, or lightning.

3. RULES FOR VISITORS AT THE CEMETERY

The cemetery will be open from seven o'clock a. m. to sunset.

No firearms, refreshments, or intoxicating liquors, shall at any time be brought upon any lot or in any portion of the cemetery, provided, however, that firearms may be used and discharged in case of a military funeral or on a regular appointed Memorial Day or other patriotic service.

No bird or animal shall be killed, wounded, or trapped upon, nor shall any animal or the eggs of any bird be removed from any lot or from any road, walk, or parkway except by the Corporation. DOGS ARE NOT
